2019/2020 in Review



2019 was another extraordinary year for Home-Start Renfrewshire and Inverclyde. 53 new families joined our service, meaning in total we supported a record-breaking 142 families and 268 children.

In accordance with our Five-year Strategic Plan we have focused our efforts upon closer partnership working. Collaboration is increasingly critical to our successful operation, offering families seamless access to expertise and facilities whilst developing awareness of the community of support. In partnership with The Cookschool at Stepwell we delivered Home-Start's 'Cook Eat Connect' Cookschool sessions for Inverclyde families, and our Chef School classes with Families First in Ferguslie. Families learnt new tasty, nutritious and affordable meals and also new opportunities for social interaction and building personal confidence. We also found a new home for our Renfrewshire Dads Group and monthly Twins Group, with KLAS Care in Linwood providing a more suitable venue enabling indoor and outdoor children's activities. Home-Start is committed to upskilling our volunteers too as we develop our expertise in new areas.

2019/2020 in Review

With the forthcoming increased hours of funded Early Learning and Childcare, we know that Home-Start's clientele will increasingly focus on supporting parents and infants under three years of age at risk of mental health problems. In total 30 volunteers have now received Understanding Perinatal Mood Disorder training delivered by Crossreach Bluebell. A further 15 Inverclyde volunteers have completed Bluebell's advanced Counselling Skills training, as well as Paediatric First Aid. We have continued also to develop our specialism in Video Interaction Guidance. Investment in Perinatal and Infant Mental Health will continue to be a priority going forward for our charity.



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Challenges Our Families Faced Due To COVID



Although this report concerns 2019-20 the shadow of COVID looms large and it would be wrong not to highlight some key work Home-Start has been performing in recent months. In the week before lockdown our core home-visiting and group support services ceased to meet face-to face and moved to provide remote support. Although we are not a crisis service, we recognised that this was an unprecedented international crisis and that the already challenged resources of Health and Social Services would be stretched even further.

Many families would feel scared and isolated, perceiving a sudden withdrawal of their usual networks of support. We understood our families' need would be greater than ever.

We resolved to increase and adapt the emotional and practical help we could offer. We implemented a weekly door-step delivery service of food and essential items for families between April and August, drawing upon Supporting Communities Funding via Linstone and Cloch Housing respectively, the Response, Recovery and Resilience Fund and the local Community Food Initiatives with FareShare. We've distributed hundreds of supermarket vouchers, baby goods and arts and crafts packs. In partnership with Save the Children's Emergency Response scheme we distributed 130 grants to families across Inverclyde and Renfrewshire who were experiencing poverty and financial hardship.

Families have told us this doorstep support made a great difference, not only financially and practically but emotionally too. Staff and volunteers could maintain socially distanced face-to-face contact and families could discuss how they were coping with confinement in the home. Aware of the stress parents have been experiencing, we provided pamper packs and survival kits for mum and dad which staff and volunteers delivered.

As Lockdown eased we resumed outdoor meetings for families and volunteers. These helped to identify concerns around parental and children's mental health. Many families were struggling with their mental health or their children's behaviour during lockdown and did not know how to access specialist services. We began operating online group sessions for parents to get peer support and sourced funding for counselling and play therapy sessions for families.

We received numerous financial and in-kind donations from a variety of organisations as well as individual volunteers throughout this period. In one instance this led to a productive partnership with Barnhill Farm in Inchinnan, who used the proceeds of their own donations to provide our families with weekly donated boxes over the summer and autumn periods. This made a huge difference to those families that were struggling the most.

Our COVID response work is ongoing, but has underlined the immense value of local organisations and charities like Home-Start that are close community they serve. Our trusting relationship with families meant that during lockdown we could still make contact and see and support families. We could respond flexibly and adapt a our services in response to changing need. Some of these families included those working whose earnings suffered and financial needs escalated rapidly over lockdown. We were in a position to intervene early to prevent family crises. Thank you to our incredible volunteers for keeping in touch with families and supporting us over the past 12 months!

2019-20 was a challenging year for the organisation, as our Renfrewshire Big Lottery project came to an end in November 2019. However, following core funding awarded by the Garfield Weston Foundation and the Kelly Family Charitable Trust we were able to maintain our core service levels. Further good news followed with the award of funding for our Dads Group by the Cattanach Trust in January 2020.

In addition to this, we successfully applied to the National Lottery Community Fund for 4 years funding towards the cost of our Inverclyde Service and the Bank of Scotland Foundation for 3 years funding towards core staff costs. Renfrewshire HSCP have provided additional funding towards our core staffing costs in 2020-21 and we hope to maintain and strengthen this relationship further going forward.

We would like to say a huge thanks to all the participants, donors and well-wishers for supporting our fundraising work throughout 2019-20. The Glasgow Bash, the Glasgow Kiltwalk and our Ladies Afternoon Tea which together raised over £35,000 for the charity. It is you who are making the real positive difference for the next generation. We continue to be awestruck by your generosity!
